

Becoming a Registered Environmentalist (CEnv and REnvP)

Understanding the Standards

Carefully read through the 'Information Booklets' which explain the education, experience and competences required for that of a Chartered Environmentalist (CEnv) or a Registered Environmental Practitioner (REnvP).

These booklets can be obtained from the IAgRE at www.iagre.org/professionalregistration or from the Society for the Environments website www.socenv.org.uk.

IAgRE has prepared the following specific guidelines for its Members.

IAgRE Application Form

You must complete an application form provided by IAgRE and return it with the supporting evidence as described below. The application can be completed on-line, via email or by post. In order to register as a CEnv or REnvP you must first become a member of IAgRE.

Update your Curriculum Vitae (CV) and provide a Competence Statement

Your CV is a very important starting point, especially the section that describes your education, relevant experience and ongoing training and continuing professional development (CPD).

At IAgRE, we have a helpful form which you can add to your CV. This form allows you to describe your skills and experience against the various knowledge requirements and competence statements listed in the CEnv and REnvP information booklets.

Initial Assessment

Please submit your Application Form and CV, which will be assessed by IAgRE staff. You will then be advised if more information is needed.

Competency Assessment

Once you have completed the initial application form provided by IAgRE, you must then create your Competence Statement. Once completed, return this with the relevant application fee to IAgRE.

Your application will be sent to experienced IAgRE Assessors who are fellow Registered Environmentalists. This is a process of peer review. If more work is required you will be advised accordingly.

For those seeking REnvP registration, please ignore the next section.

Professional Review Interview (CEnv only)

For those seeking CEnv, the next stage of the assessment process is the 'Professional Review Interview' (PRI).

This will be a face to face interview and normally last for between 40 and 60 minutes. It may be conducted concurrently with an application to become a full voting, (corporate) member of IAgRE, but can equally be a stand-alone review.

The PRI gives you the opportunity to further demonstrate under critical examination, knowledge and understanding, competence and engagement in sustainable environmental management and development.

Many people preparing for their PRI will include a short presentation of not more than 10 minutes. This will allow the use of visual images and photographs to illustrate your work.

Further Guidance is available on the PRI process and frequently asked questions.

Ratification of Assessment

All assessment decisions are reviewed by the IAgRE Membership Committee. This meets every two months so there may be some delay before you are informed of the final decision.

Once your Chartered Environmentalist or Registered Environmental Practitioner status has been ratified you will be informed in writing. IAgRE will also inform the Society for the Environment who will allocate you with a registration number.

In due course you will receive a formal certificate from the Society for the Environment.
